Find out how you'll be affected if you live or run a business in the Parkhead, Bridgeton, Dalmarnock, Camlachie areas at our next community information event:

- Tuesday 27 May 2014
- Emirates Arena, 1000 London Road, G40 3HG
- Doors open at 17.30

The session will cover:

- the specific impact of the Games on your area.
- key dates for venue preparation and build.
- traffic management and parking plans, including road closures and parking permits, if required.

- changes to council services (e.g. refuse collection).

If you receive home care or another kind of social care support these organisations will be in touch with you directly to let you know about any arrangements that may need to be put in place to deliver your existing service and care provision.

Those who live, work or run businesses close to Games venues, Road Race routes or live sites may be affected in particular, and it is important to be aware of the impact so you can plan ahead.

Celtic Park will host the Games' Opening Ceremony on 23 July. The ceremony begins at 21.00 and will be watched by 40,000 spectators. Badminton and Track Cycling will take place at the Emirates Arena and Sir Chris Hoy Velodrome respectively.

From 24 to 27 July, 11.00 to 19.30, 2,700 spectators will be able to watch each session of the Track Cycling.

The Badminton competition will take place 23 July to 3 August, with 15,000 spectators expected on the busiest day. Sessions start at 9.00 and finish at 22.30

Road Courses: impact on travel

Look out for the fast, fun and free-to-view action on closed city streets:

- Marathon: Sunday 27 July 2014
- Cycling Time Trial: Thursday 31 July 2014
- Cycling Road Race: Sunday 3 August 2014

Traffic management measures will be in place to allow competition to take place and keep traffic flowing around the city, so plan your Games Time travel in advance.
