Glasgow Green will play host to the start and finish lines for the Road Courses - the Marathon, Cycle Time Trial and Cycle Road Race as well as the Festival 2014 Live Site. The Glasgow National Hockey Centre will host the Hockey competition

The Marathon, Road Race and Time Trial will be held on 27 July, 31 July and 3 August respectively. These free to view races will take place on closed city streets. A programme of traffic management measures and road closures will be implemented on the days to facilitate competition. Routes available at www.getreadyglasgow.com

The Hockey competition will run on various dates from 24 July to 3 August and will attract 21,500 on the busiest day. Sessions start from 09.00 with up to three sessions per day.

Road Courses: impact on travel

Look out for the fast, fun and free-to-view action on closed city streets:

- Marathon: Sunday 27 July 2014
- Cycling Time Trial: Thursday 31 July 2014
- Cycling Road Race: Sunday 3 August 2014

Traffic management measures will be in place to allow competition to take place and keep traffic flowing around the city, so plan your Games Time travel in advance.
