# Wise Women Project

# 5 Public Input

- Representative from Dennistoun branch of Living Rent spoke. GHA Wellpark Community hall has not re-opened since closing for Covid. Residents are concerned about being overlooked due to a focus on the new Meatmarket development (which is to contain a community hub). Seeking support from DCC on this issue. Other issues noted to exist: communication, rent rises, maintenance, etc. Cllr Casey noted social distancing and ventilation issues associated with the small hall, and that a community liaison officer role is being instigated by GHA.
- Public enquiry about noticeboard locations (Wellpark and Haghill); maintenance and location choice of public recycling points queried; sympathy for operatives noted; lack of resources is a key issue; focus on statutory requirement to clear general waste has contributed. Request for a review of locations met with an invite from Cllrs Casey and Long to get in touch to arrange.

# 6 Elected Member Updates

### Cllr Casey

- Gully cleaning on Duke Street has been followed up with Neighbourhood Co-ordinator Charlie Keane and relevant department. Weather permitting, south side programmed for Thursday, and north side the week after.
- Commercial use of public bins and recycling acknowledged, resulting in problems arising due to amended bin provision intended to deal with this (e.g. Fir Park).
- Whitehill Pool working group relaunch meeting due to take place in approximately two weeks time. Recruitment is an issue hampering progress.

## Cllr Long

- Parks improvement and corner sites still in progress.
- Cumbernauld Road resurfacing between Aitken and Aberdour carried out (but without adequate notice), which has been chased up. Road safety around Alexandra Parade Primary School.
- Enquiry about involvement with Calton DAP has been confirmed as acknowledged.
- This will be Cllr Long's last attendance at a DCC meeting in tge capacity of Cllr.

#### Paul Sweeney MSP

- Former Haghill School building roof collapsed in summer 2021. Walter Street frontage will be saved. Archways and decorative stonework saved for on-site use in future development. Controlled demolition and flat storage deemed to be more appropriate than ongoing support by a frame. Hopefully this can be done with similar properties in the future. CCllr concerns raised about stripping of ironwork and other assets on this and other buildings by the owner.
- Discussion underway about ScotRail service level provision after trains come back under public control.
- Licensed overdose prevention centres being discussed in parliament.
- Transport Projects Review (including potential Glasgow Metro).
- Noise pollution from motorway and other sources is under review to assess mitigation measures.
- Golfhill School site owners hoping to commence construction within weeks.
- TSB property potentially returning to a proposal for a food premises.
- Discussions with Friends of Alexandra Park about fountain repair maintenance.
- Some snagging issues noted with initial applications for free transport for young people. Looking into extending this provision to include asylum seekers. Would be approx 5000 people, approx £300k annual, approx 0.1% of budget, so a minimal cost for a significant help to vulnerable persons.
- Noted measures to address the tenement repair backlog.

- Whitehill Pool £900k total funding in place for upcoming planned works, but contractor and supply backlog means delivery not earlier than Q3 2022. Options paper from GCC NRS notes a £5m cost for further required repairs; £17m for full repair with a 2 year closure.
- Shadow Finance £371m funding defecit identified; £121m made up to to LAs by ScotGov; £250m resultant shortfall. Between £22m and £33.9m shortfall for Glasgow CC.
- Responding to a question about playpark upgrade delivery, PS will submit a written enquiry to ScotGov.
