- Bill of Save Whitehill Pool spoke. He's had no response to enquiries submitted to David McCready shortly after the May meeting. Non confirmation on when opening hours will be extended (by employing a 'second shift') – no confirmation on when this will occur, or even a target date. No increase in time for the school holidays: the weekly opening hours are unchanged (5 days of 6 hours = 30 hours per week). However, there are "free family" sessions on offer each day, which hopefully attract more people to attend. The Teaching Pool is still unused. Some progress has been made to bring the pool back into use. A new contractor is currently working to address the pool drainage issues. Cosmetic changes in the form of a new ceiling and lighting are also planned.

### 9 Public Input

Dennistoun Area Community Sports Hub

Update from Bill:

- Members who are based or have activities in the Dennistoun area, include, Whitehill and Temple Swimming Clubs, Milnbank Sports Hub, Bluevale Community Hub and Boxing Club, Glasgow Saints, Disability Badminton, Shettleston Harriers, Active Schools, Finnart Football Academy, St Andrews Orienteering Club.

- The aim of DACSH is to increase sport and activity participation and opportunities in the area, for all ages and ability. It is strongly supported by both Glasgow Life and Sportscotland. Sportscotland have provided funds to allow two people to be employed full time, starting before end of July. One will act as activity co-ordinator (with some coach input), the other will be an activity coach. They will work within the community to increase interest in sport and activities for all ages from pre-school age to senior citizens.

- Activities include Archery, pickleball, tennis, badminton, volleyball, basketball, bowling, petanque, walking, cycling and much more.

- DACSH would like to hear from activity providers in the area and aim to boost membership.

### **10** Elected Member Updates

Paul Sweeney MSP

- Wheatley Group have confirmed intention to commence work on ex-District Hospital facade retention and residential development.

- Spectrum have also been approached regarding the delays at ex-Golfhill School.

- A specialist company has been approached to establish cost of Alexandra Park Fountain repair.

- Reidvale HA: has written to Scottish Parliament Housing Committee (responsible for Scottish Housing Regulator) to express dissatisfaction about the circumstances and process related to the potential HA transfer.

- Scottish Power heritage cabinets: met with SP maintenance manager in Partick, who was sympathetic to the desire to retain them. SP have agreed to publish an annual list of cabinets identified for removal to allow review of locations and potential retention in situ or elsewhere. GCC heritage officer is also involved, as many cabinets (e.g. ex-lighting/tram-related) are Council-owned.

### 11 Any Other Business

- Heather Morton (dennistounmuralproject), seeking support for mural at 'Lidl gable end'. "I have been working to look into funding options for the mural and have found that most will require an organisation with a related bank account to apply for the funding. I wondered if DCC could be the organisation that could apply for this funding on behalf of the mural project? As it is just myself running the project, I don't have the means to set up an organisation and bank account myself (nor does it feel necessary for one sole project). If I could apply through DCC to secure funding that would be very much appreciated and help to kick start the project ASAP."

	- Collective agreement that it would not be appropriate to act as a body to apply for and hold funds due to concerns over accountability for a project not being run by a CCIIr or Associate CCIIr, and previous experience complications experienced by DCC when applying for funding for	
	projects associated with Alexandra Park Festival. >> <b>Reply to Heather.</b> - VT and WW do not intend to re-stand for their office-bearer roles at the AGM. Planning meeting will discuss arrangements for AGM.	WW
